

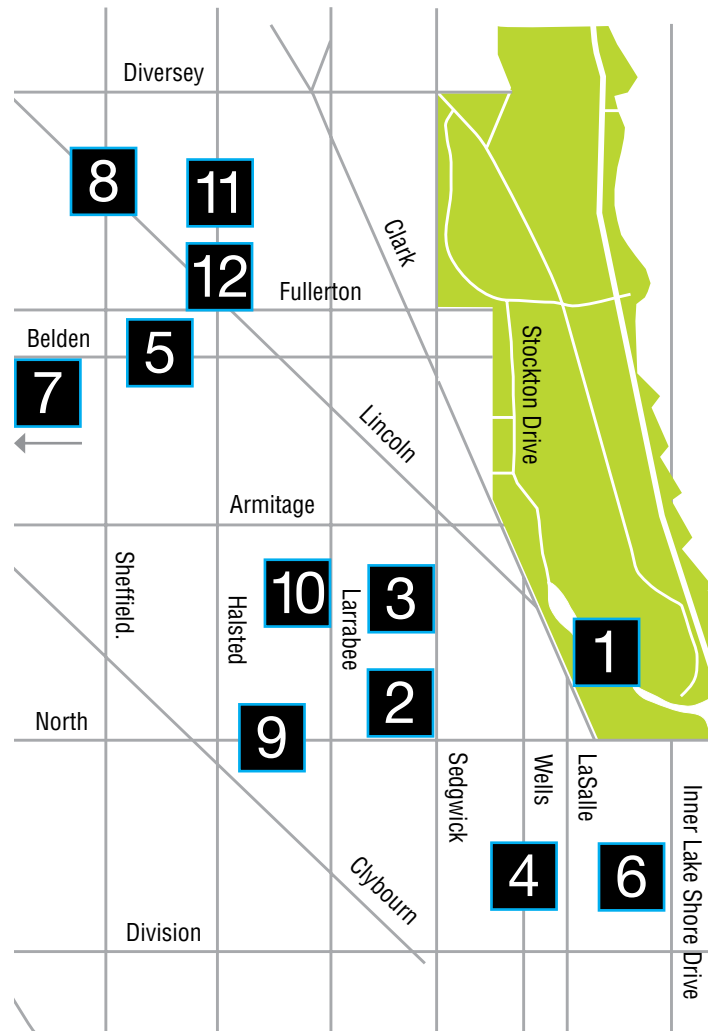

It is the common name for a green pigment obtained through the application of acetic acid to copper plates or the natural patina formed when copper, brass or bronze is weathered and exposed to air or seawater over a period of time.

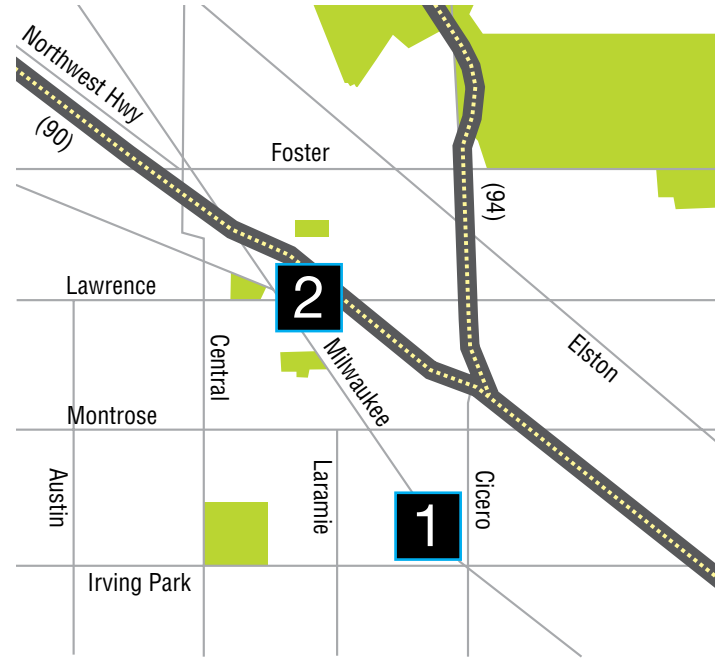

What is Powder Coating?

The main difference between a conventional liquid paint and a powder coating is that the powder coating does not require a solvent to keep the binder and filler parts in a liquid suspension form.

The coating is applied electrostatically and is then cured under heat to allow it to flow and form a “skin” onto the metal.

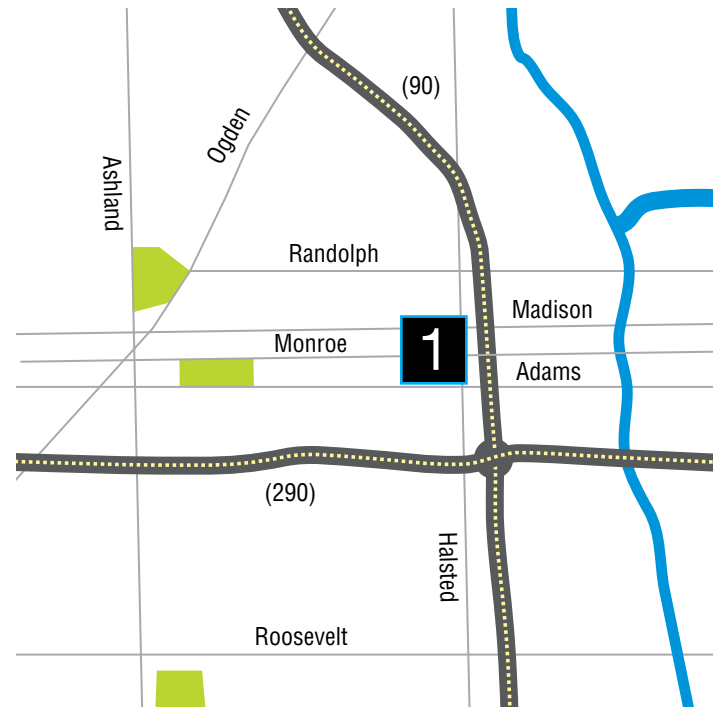
What is a Maquette?

A maquette (French word for scale model, sometimes referred to by the Italian names *plastico* or *modello*) is a small scale model or rough draft of an unfinished sculpture.

An equivalent term is *bozzetto*, from the Italian word that means “sketch”.

It is used to visualize and test shapes and ideas without incurring the cost and effort of producing a full-scale product. All of the artists in the year’s show are asked to create a maquette of their sculpture, so that the jurors can get a better sense of how the finished work will fit into the proposed site.
